Editorial

1 The first two issues of the Journal will, exceptionally, be composed of invited contributions, and will contain two articles of more than normal length. Subsequent issues will be peerreviewed, and contain four/five articles of up to 7500 words.

The *Portuguese Journal of Social Science* is an English-language scholarly journal publishing work in the social sciences relating to Portugal, whether directly or in a comparative perspective. It is published by Intellect on behalf of UNICS (*Unidade de Investigação em Ciências Sociais*), the Social Science Research Unit of ISCTE (*Instituto Superior de Ciências do Trabalho e da Empresa* - Higher Institute for Labour and Business Studies), which is a state-funded university institute located in Lisbon. The Journal will be edited by an Editorial Committee based in UNICS, assisted by an international Editorial Board.

ISCTE is currently the largest university institution in Portugal in the field of the social sciences, offering first degrees and postgraduate qualifications in Business Studies, Technological Sciences (Architecture, Computing and Telecommunication Engineering), and the Social Sciences (Anthropology, Economics, History, Social Psychology, Sociology and Planning). UNICS, currently funded by the Fundação para a Ciência e a Tecnologia, coordinates the activities of seven associated Research Centres (Centre for African Studies, Centre for Research in Social Anthropology, Centre for Contemporary Portuguese History, Centre for Territorial Studies, Centre for Sociological Studies and Research, Centre for Social Research and Intervention, and DINÂMIA) as well as research undertaken directly by the Anthropology and Sociology Departments.

The Journal will publish work in the fields covered by the activities of UNICS by authors from Portugal and elsewhere. There will be three issues a year, complemented by a guest-edited book-length volume devoted to a specific theme. The Journal aims to provide an international forum for the publication and discussion of work mainly concerning Portugal, as well as introducing an international readership to the best work currently being produced by Portuguese scholarship in the social sciences - work which has to date only been available in Portuguese and in scattered French- and Englishlanguage journals, or in conference proceedings. Much of this work, of general interest to the social science community as well as of particular interest to specialists in Latin America and Southern Europe, has tended until now to be neglected by readers who do not readily read Portuguese or who do not have access to Portuguese language journals. Articles will normally be original, though the Journal is prepared to consider work previously published in languages other than English. All articles will be anonymously peerreviewed.1
